

Morning Prayer and Holy Eucharist at the Church of St. Paul, Cambria Trinity Sunday • The first Sunday after Pentecost • June 15, 2025 •

Opening Hymn 509

Blessed be God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

And blessed be his kingdom, now and for ever.

Amen.

Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Penitential Rite

Existing in splendor before time began, eternal, all-powerful and perfect in yourself, you yet draw near to us, O God most high, rejoicing in the earth your creatures inhabit, delighting in the human race your hands have made. Pour forth your love into our hearts by the gift of your Holy Spirit, and by that Spirit guide us into all truth, especially the truth of our limitedness and frailty. That we may be at peace with you, through our Lord Jesus Christ, let us now confess our sins against you and our neighbors.

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. Amen.

Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty: Who was and is, and is to come.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

Psalm 63:1-8 Deus, Deus meus

- O God, you are my God; eagerly I seek you; my soul thirsts for you, my flesh faints for you, as in a barren and dry land where there is no water.
- Therefore I have gazed upon you in your holy place, that I might behold your power and your glory.
- For your loving-kindness is better than life itself; my lips shall give you praise.
- So will I bless you as long as I live and lift up my hands in your Name.
- My soul is content, as with marrow and fatness, and my mouth praises you with joyful lips, When I remember you upon my bed, and meditate on you in the night watches.
- For you have been my helper, and under the shadow of your wings I will rejoice. My soul clings to you; your right hand holds me fast.

Psalm 8

- 1 O Lord our Governor, *how exalted is your Name in all the world!
- 2 Out of the mouths of infants and children *your majesty is praised above the heavens.
- 3 You have set up a stronghold against your adversaries, *to quell the enemy and the avenger.
- 4 When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, *the moon and the stars you have set in their courses.
- 5 What is man that you should be mindful of him? *the son of man that you should seek him out?
- 6 You have made him but little lower than the angels; *you adorn him with glory and honor;
- 7 You give him mastery over the works of your hands; *you put all things under his feet:
- 8 All sheep and oxen, *even the wild beasts of the field,
- 9 The birds of the air, the fish of the sea, *and whatsoever walks in the paths of the sea.
- 10 O Lord our Governor, *how exalted is your Name in all the world!

The Celebrant says to the people The Lord be with you. And also with you. Let us pray:

Almighty and everlasting God, you have given to us your servants grace, by the confession of a true faith, to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity, and in the power of your divine Majesty to worship the Unity: Keep us steadfast in this faith and worship, and bring us at last to see you in your one and eternal glory, O Father; who with the Son and the Holy Spirit live and reign, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

The first reading is from Proverbs (8:1-4, 22-31)

Does not wisdom call, and does not understanding raise her voice?

On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out:

"To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all that live. The Lord created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago. Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water.

Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth-- when he had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil. When he established the heavens, I was there, when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth, then I was beside him, like a master worker; and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always, rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the human race."

Canticle13: A Song of Praise

Glory to you, Lord God of our fathers; * you are worthy of praise; glory to you.

The second reading is from Romans (5:1-5)

Since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

Surely, it is God who saves me;* I will trust in him and not be afraid.

For us who celebrate community here, that our labors spread joy and our witness bring peace, we pray to the Lord. **Lord, hear our prayer.**

O God, our Father from whom good things flow, we thank you and praise you, singing *Holy*. Answer our prayer and bring us hope through Christ your Son, who celebrates life with you in the unity of the Spirit, now and forever. **Amen.**

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN.**

Because in Christ we have received the Spirit of adoption, as sons and daughters of God we dare to pray:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your Name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial, and deliver us from

evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

Alleluia, alleluia! Let us go forth in the name of Christ.

Thanks be to God. Alleluia, alleluia!

The Breaking of the Bread-

Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us; Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

God's holy gifts for God's holy people: Draw near with awe and faith, with praise and thanksgiving.

After Communion, the Celebrant says

Eternal God, may we who share Christ's banquet be one with him as he is one with you. Let us pray.

Eternal God, heavenly Father, you have graciously accepted us as living members of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ, and you have fed us with spiritual food in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood. Send us now into the world in peace, and grant us strength and courage to love and serve you with gladness and singleness of heart; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Knowing that all of our community cannot share the Eucharist in person, we affirm that the true mystical communion of Christ and His Church is a bond of spirit and heart, grounded in faith. Therefore, we commit ourselves to the reality that Christ is with us wherever we are. **Amen.**
